Resolution in Response to Recent Safety Issues on Northgate

- Whereas:** On Wednesday, June 1, 2005 a graduate student at Texas A&M University was assaulted physically and verbally, with racial epithets, by individuals near the corner of College Main and Church in College Station, Texas; and
- Whereas:** The Student Senate is a strong advocate of students of all backgrounds and is greatly concerned with the safety and well-being of all students of Texas A&M University; and
- Whereas:** The Faculty and Staff Committed to an Inclusive Campus Committee issued a report entitled "Recommendations for TAMU Responses to Recent Incidents of Hate in Northgate" (the "FSCIC Report") on June 8, 2005; and
- Whereas:** The FSCIC Report calls for action to include both short term and long term institutional response to safety issues in Northgate- action that although will undoubtedly take time, has the potential to greatly improve safety in addition to domestic and international student relations, as evidenced by those suggestions already implemented by the administration of Texas A&M University.
